## Outline of Japan's Major Grant Assistance to Sri Lanka in 2022

- Today, September 16, in light of challenging economic and humanitarian situation in Sri Lanka, we have decided to provide emergency grant aid worth 3.5 Million USD. This is the second round of assistance under the Emergency Grant Scheme to Sri Lanka. In the most recent months of August and September alone, we have provided a total of approximately \$13.8 Million worth major grant assistance to Sri Lanka.
- ➤ The friendly relationship between Japan and Sri Lanka began with the historic speech of His Excellency J.R. Jayewardene at the San Francisco Peace Conference on September 6, 1951, and we are celebrating its 70th anniversary this year. Reflecting this friendly relationship, Japan has continued to support sustainable development in Sri Lanka under three priority areas of (1) Promoting quality growth, (2) Development cooperation for inclusive growth, and (3) Mitigating vulnerability, amounting to approximately 143 Billion JPY (As of March 31, 2020).
- ➤ In the year 2022, we have so far provided a total of approximately 36.5 Million USD for major grant assistance (As of September 16), particularly under priority areas (2) and (3).
- ➤ We will continue our support for Sri Lanka's sustainable development, as well as deepen our bilateral relations through the visit of Honorable Ranil Wickremesinghe, President of Sri Lanka, to Japan scheduled later this month.
